Project Respect is a non-government organisation which challenges exploitation of and violence against women in the sex industry. Project Respect was established in late 1998 to work with women and girls in the sex industry and began direct service work in 2000.

We conduct outreach to brothels in metropolitan Melbourne and rural and regional areas of Victoria. We have a particular focus on women trafficked to Australia for prostitution, and other women experiencing harm and violence in the sex industry.

Complimenting direct services, Project Respect undertakes advocacy and public education and collaborates closely with partners in trafficking ‘sending countries’, particularly the Asia-Pacific region.

Dr. Sallie Yea is the Director of **IDEALS**. Sallie has been lecturing and researching in International Development for the past 10 years at universities in both Australia and New Zealand. She has developed and taught a range of subjects on gender and development, gender and globalisation, counter-human trafficking, and participatory development. She has also carried out ethnographic and in-depth research with trafficking victims in South Korea, the Philippines and Australia.

COMMUNITY TRAINING WORKSHOP

“Trafficking of Women & Girls for Prostitution-Issues and Responses”

This full-day training workshop is open to community workers and interested members of the public who seek to gain a solid foundational knowledge of the process and impacts of trafficking of women and girls for prostitution into Australia.

The training will allow you to:

- Engage with the concepts which draw together issues of prostitution and trafficking and how they impact on one another.
- Expand your ability to actively identify indicators of trafficking and respond appropriately;
- A critical examination of State, Federal and International Law and the need for policy reform in Australia;
- Examples of good practice in victim recovery, support and justice;
- Real case studies based on Australian research conducted under the auspices of Project Respect

“Relevance of Training Workshops for Community Organisations”

Trafficking for prostitution has been on the national agenda for some time and recently there has been widespread media coverage, especially with the film “The Jammed”. This has resulted with more women trying to access support.

Despite this attention, too little is known about the impact of trafficking in Australia and there is a lack of coordination between organisations working on the issue. There remains an urgent need to bring people together for collaborative interagency approaches to address violence against trafficked women and other women in the sex industry.

Many parallels can be drawn between these issues, domestic violence, and sexual assault. Lessons learned addressing domestic violence and sexual assault can be extended to prostitution and trafficking.

Community services and more specifically, women’s services, have a unique role to play. This training will strengthen workers’ capacity to take up this role so there is a greater emphasis on access and support for the women.
